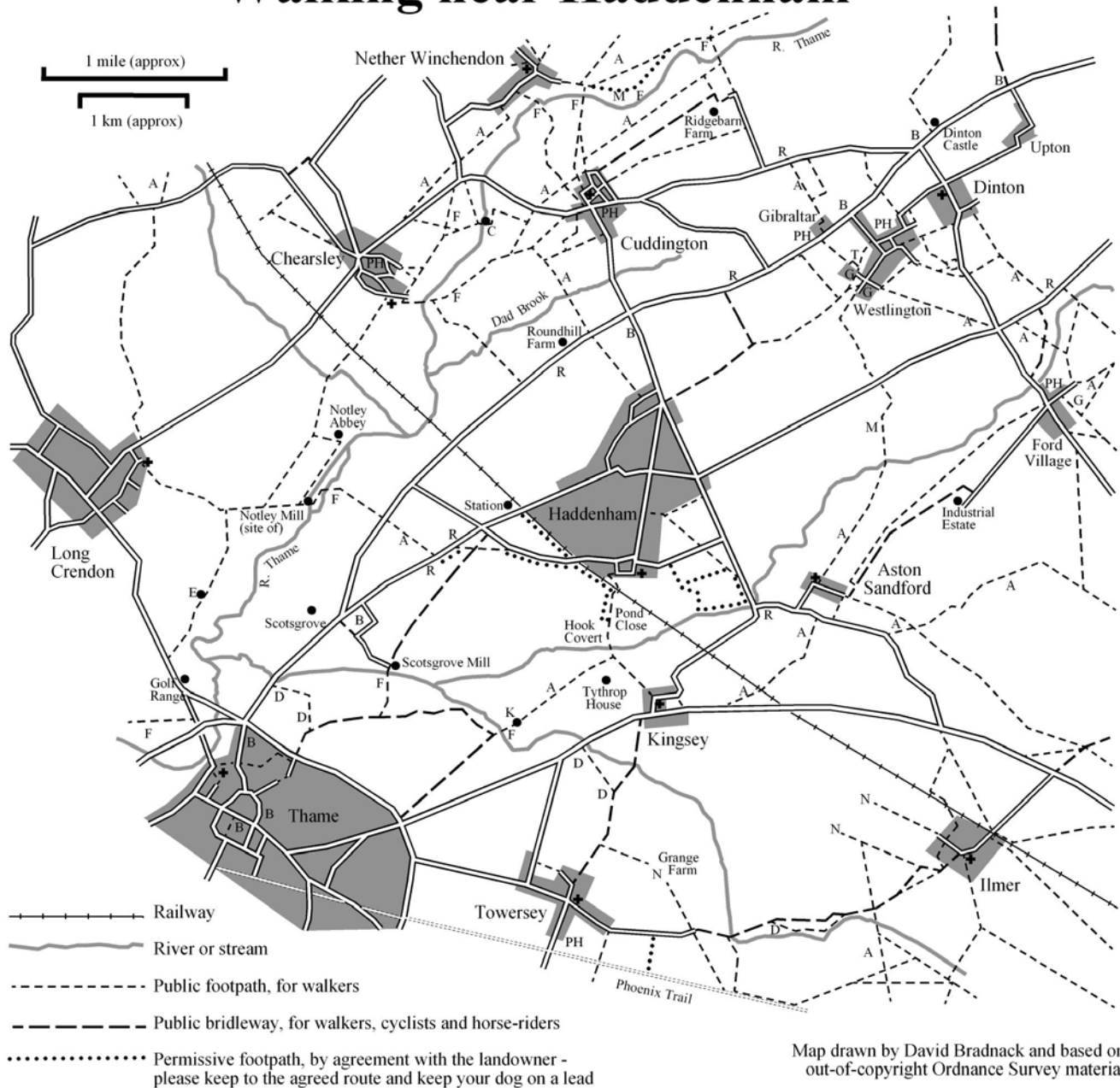


Walking near Haddenham



A	Arable, may be heavy going when wet. By law the way should be clear of crops and marked out, though the farmer has 2 weeks to do this after ploughing.	F	Floods after heavy rain.
B	Bus stops (not marked in Haddenham).	G	The path goes through the gardens as the right of way was there before the garden.
C	Heading west at Cuddington Mill the path goes through the door in the high stone wall, then in front of the house and across the footbridge. Heading east, the door is straight ahead after you pass the house.	K	At Keepers's Cottage the drive towards Tythrop House is private.
D	Difficult to use at present.	M	Muddy except in really dry conditions.
E	Exit from the Crendon Industrial Estate opposite where you entered, but you may need to zigzag round a diversion.	N	No right of way at present.
		PH	Pub: not marked in Haddenham, Thame and Long Crendon, where there are several.
		R	Road walking needs special care here.
		T	The strict route goes across the tennis court, but most people go round.

Walking near Haddenham

Suggested walks

1. There and back to the pubs in Long Crendon, Chearsley, Cuddington, Gibraltar, Dinton, Ford or Towersey, or to shops, cafes, pubs etc in Thame (about 3 miles, 5km, each way; less to Cuddington).
2. Bridleway to Scotsgrove Mill, then over bridges and fields ahead to track, left, back via Keeper's Cottage (K) and Hook Covert (3½ miles, 5½ km).
3. Bus to Scotsgrove, a few yards along the main road, left down bridleway, along Mill Lane to Scotsgrove Mill, then left along bridleway towards Station Road, permissive path towards Church End (2 miles, 3km).
4. Bus to Gibraltar ("Dinton New Road" stop), then towards Ridgebarn Farm, cross R. Thame, back via Nether Winchendon and Cuddington (5 miles, 8 km).
5. Bus to Thame, along alley next to Co-op then ahead along Moreton Lane, turn left along Phoenix Trail to Towersey, back via Kingsey (5 miles, 8 km).
6. Pond Close, Kingsey, Aston Sandford, Ford, Dinton, Westlington and back past Londis shop (7 miles, 11½ km).
7. Aston Sandford (perhaps via Pond Close and Kingsey to avoid road walking) Ilmer, Towersey, Kingsey (7 to 9 miles, 11 to 14 km).
8. Bus to the first stop in Thame, then towards church, old road towards Long Crendon, turn right beyond golf range and back via Notley Mill, or via Chearsley and past Roundhill Farm (4 to 6 miles, 6 to 10 km).
9. Circuit via Notley, Chearsley, Nether Winchendon and/or Cuddington, Dinton, Ford, Aston Sandford, Kingsey (about 12½ miles, 20 km).

Other Resources

For more detailed descriptions of some routes near Haddenham, borrow *Walking from Haddenham* by Diana and Peter Gulland from Haddenham library. Since the book was written, the routes have remained the same, but there have been a number of changes to nearby features, so the descriptions may not always match exactly.

The Ordnance Survey Explorer maps (orange cover) at a scale of 1:25,000 (2½ inches per mile) are recommended. As far west as Scotsgrove Mill is on sheet 181 Chiltern Hills North, and the rest on 180 Oxford Witney & Woodstock.
